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


### PINK SHIRT DAY-POST IT POSITIVE

# HUNDREDS DAY



## **PBIS Update**

We are continuing to focus on teaching the school wide positive behaviour expectations that are the foundations of creating a safe, caring and orderly school. The January assembly focused on teaching the meaning of respect. Students learned that showing respect for places includes using the sidewalks and respecting property. They also were reminded that they can show respect for things by asking to borrow something instead of just taking and being careful with other people's belongings. Finally, they were reminded that being respectful to people means using kinds words, respecting their personal space, and keeping their hands to themselves. At the end of the assembly names were drawn from our "second chance Valley Viper box" and 20 students were given a prize as a way of saying thank you for following our expectations. I see a real sense of pride when students receive a Valley Viper ticket for doing well with our behaviour expectations. Well done Cinnabar!

# **REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

We are currently accepting in-catchment registrations for all grades as well as out-of-catchment applications for the 2016-2017 school year. In –catchment registrations can be accepted until June 16, 2016 although we appreciate getting the registrations as soon as possible to allow for accurate planning for next year. Out-of-catchment applications are due by March 31.

Families who know they will be moving or changing schools next year are asked to let the office know as soon as possible. We don't typically get a request for records until the end of June.

Please remember to bring your child's birth certificate and a proof of address to any school office for registration documentation.

## CEDAR HIGH SCHOOL and Bussing to John Barsby

Families are reminded that Cinnabar Valley Elementary School students will be transitioned to the newly reopening Cedar Secondary school effective September 2016. The school locater function on the School District Website has not reflected the change.

Please also note that bus service for students in the Cinnabar Valley catchment to John Barsby will end at the end of June 2016. Out of catchment students will be required to find their own transportation to John Barsby. Bussing will be available to Cedar Secondary for those students who qualify.

All adults who volunteer in any capacity in the school are required to have a Criminal Record Check. This would include all PAC members and those people who help out with Hot Lunch on Fridays.
