



STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP

We continue to urge parents/families to exercise caution when dropping off or picking up children. SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING AND OUR VALUE FOR THIS MONTH: HONESTY

Honesty is about both speaking and acting truthfully. How do we show we are being honest? Here are some ways to be honest and practice honesty:

1. Admitting When You Were Wrong

Honest people are willing to say that they were wrong about something.

2. Choosing Not to Cheat

Cheating is dishonest while following the rules is honest.

3. Saying When You've Had Your Fair Share

An honest person will choose not to take more than their fair share.

4. Speaking Up When Something Upsets You

Sometimes honesty means having the courage to speak when you don't have to.

5. Saying An Unpopular Truth

Throughout history, brave people have been honest about sharing the truth even if it was harmful to them.

6. Returning Something That Belongs To Others

If you have something that doesn't belong to you, the right thing is to return it.

7. And finally being honest, means being the best version of yourself.

PROGRESS REPORTS

Formal report cards will be issued **February 4**. Teachers have been and will continue to provide **Ongoing Communicate Student Learning (OCSL)** to you in a variety of ways through work samples sent home in paper form or electronically, or Celebrations of Learning. Our teachers have been working very hard together to create templates and samples of student learning that will clearly inform you of your students' ongoing progress and achievements at school.

Remember, in OCSL you can expect to see 1) Learning Outcomes (curricular competencies) that the students are practicing, 2) descriptive feedback from teachers regarding student work, 3) student self-reflection, 4) real-time samples of everyday work.

SCHOOL CLOSURES

If district schools are closed due to snow, or any other weather-related problems, announcements will be made on local radio stations (WOLF 106.9 FM, WAVE 102.3 FM, and 91.7 COAST FM) by 7 a.m. on the day of the closure. Please do not call the radio station – tune in and listen for the announcements, which will be made on a regular basis. In addition, the district will post the information on the district's website, Twitter, Facebook and mobile app. Please keep in mind, however, that there may be situations where this is not always possible, for example power outages or technical problems. The most reliable method is to listen to the local radio stations. As always, whether schools remain open, it is always your right to decide if it is safe for your children to travel to school. The district makes a best decision for all children as a whole, but you can determine what is best for your individual children in any given circumstance.
