What does inclusion look like in a classroom?

An inclusive classroom is a classroom where students with and without learning differences learn together. Inclusive classrooms are welcoming and support the diverse academic, social, emotional and communication needs of all students.

Class Placements

We are in the process of planning for the next school year. During this important process, we are keeping the students' well-being foremost in our minds. It is important you trust the school team to build classes, which suit both the students' academic and social needs. We make up each class list in a way that maximizes the quality of teaching and learning conditions for all students. The decision for placement is based on many factors, such as: balancing learning abilities, learning styles, levels of independence, social/emotional maturity, and maximizing the positive learning environment for the whole class. The classroom composition for each grade must reflect the acceptance of all individuals within an inclusive school as we attempt to provide appropriate educational programming to all children. If you have specific educational information, that you would like us to consider about your child, please contact your school Principal (in writing) as soon as possible, but **no later than (June 3)**. We do consider this request, along with all other pertinent information provided by classroom teachers and support staff. Please note that your request will be considered, however we cannot guarantee it will be honoured. In addition, please know that teachers often change schools and grade groupings are dependent on our enrollment numbers each year. With this in mind, please describe optimal learning environments for vour child, without referring to specific teachers. We are not able to take requests for individual teachers.
